## TEACHERS' TRAINING PROGRAM

The event was a memorable occasion, celebrating both the literary talents and the leadership qualities of the students at Queens School and Queens Infants and Toddlers Development Centre.



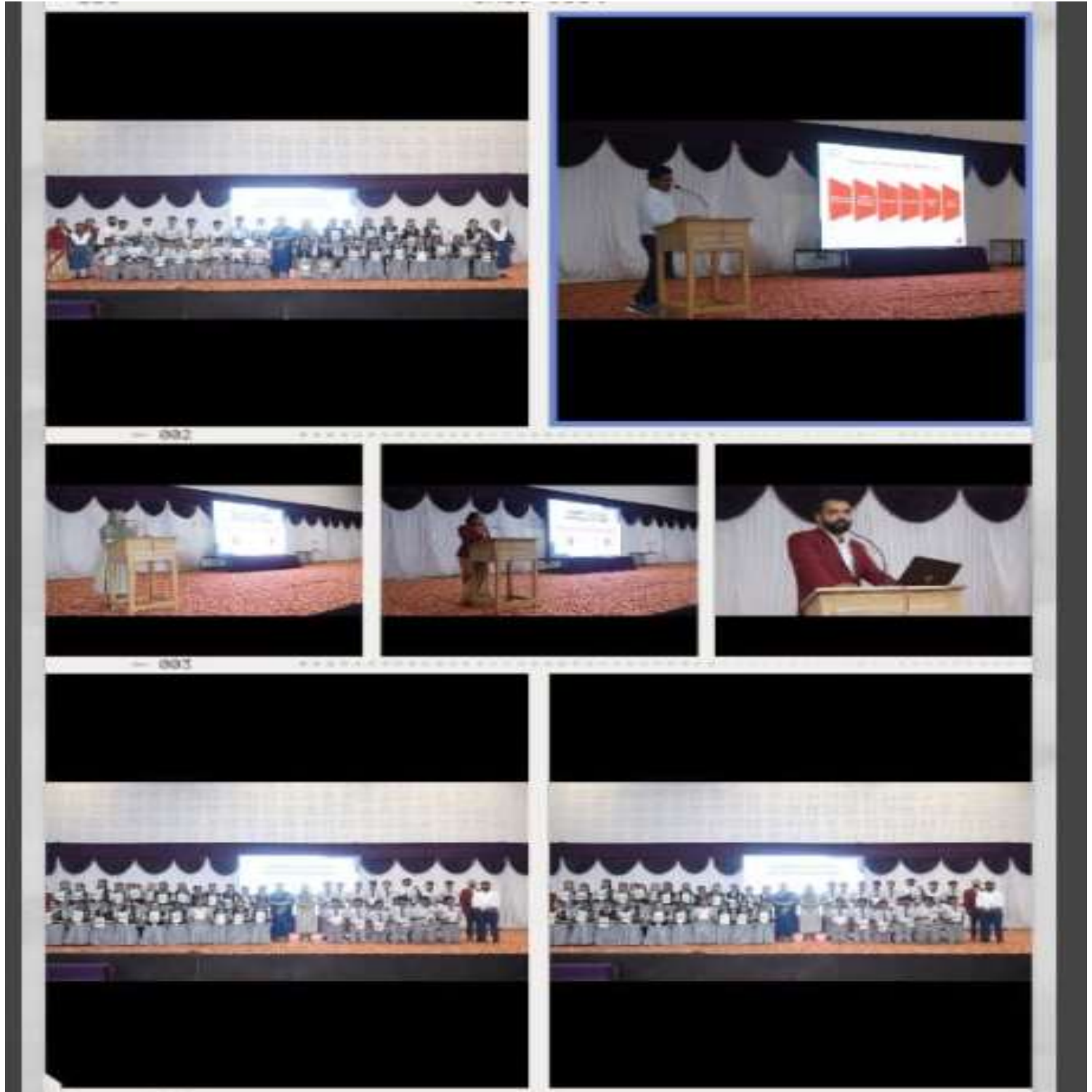
## INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATIONS
